
KS1 Newsletter

Mathematics

We spent the first few weeks of the year working on our place value skills. We practised reading numbers up to 100, in and out of sequence. We also used different equipment to make these numbers. Then we applied these skills within addition and subtraction number sentences. We learnt about 2D and 3D shape names and the properties of these too. After this we looked at different coins and their values. We started to combine coins to make different amounts.

Geography

In geography we have been learning about human and physical geographical features. We looked at the different physical features in the area like the beach. Then we thought about the human features like the buildings and roads. We looked for different features on our trip to the local museum. We also looked at maps and the route we would take to walk there.
