- \Diamond The children were excited to explore Fireworks in different ways. They created pictures using different techniques such as paint blowing, fork printing and with chalks. They wrote simple words to describe fireworks, including what they could hear and see.
- The children have enjoyed learning within their role play areas. They have been on camping trips, been vets, worked in pet shops and loved being elves in a Santa's workshop.
- This half term we followed the children's interests from our visit to the woodland area. The children noticed a hedgehog hibernation hut which led to us learning about hibernation, nocturnal animals and how to look after unwell animals. We had a visitor from Brent Lodge animal hospital.
- We celebrated Children in Need day and learnt about Remembrance day. We took part in activities linked to these celebrations and explored our school value of Kindness to others within these.
